Calabria, with its coastlines and wild nature, will be a pleasant surprise, while the **Amalfi Coast** and the **Pompeii** archaeological site will further enrich this unforgettable journey. An adventure through the sea, history, and culture that will let you discover the beating heart of the Mediterranean. Ready to go?



## PROGRAM



### **Day 1: Arrival in Rome**

The first day is dedicated to arriving in the Italian capital, Rome. Time to settle in, stroll through its historic streets, soak in the unique atmosphere of the city, and perhaps begin discovering some of its wonders, such as the Colosseum or the Pantheon.



**Day 2: From Rome to Civitavecchia – 231 km/143 miles**

Leaving Rome, the journey heads towards the port of Civitavecchia. Along the way, you visit Fara in Sabina, a charming town nestled in the Lazio countryside, and Lake Bracciano, a stunning natural oasis. The day ends in Civitavecchia, where you board the ferry to Sardinia.

Highlights: Fara in Sabina – Lake Bracciano

**Day 3: From Olbia to Alghero – 276 km/171 miles**

After arriving in Olbia, the journey to Alghero begins. Highlights include Tempio Pausania, a city rich in traditions and monuments; the enchanting Valley of the Moon, known for its unique landscape of massive granite rocks; Castelsardo, one of Italy's most beautiful villages with its fascinating castle; Stintino, famous for the stunning La Pelosa Beach; and finally Alghero, with its Catalan charm.

Highlights: Tempio Pausania, Valley of the Moon, Castelsardo, Stintino, Alghero

**Day 4: From Alghero to Cala Gonone – 234 km/145 miles**

Departing from Alghero, you take the spectacular coastal road to Bosa, a colorful and historic village. Next, visit the Nuraghe Losa, a significant relic of Nuragic civilization, and traverse the Gennargentu mountains, the rugged heart of Sardinia. The day continues with the famous murals of Orgosolo, symbols of local culture, and ends in Cala Gonone, overlooking a beautiful coastline.

Highlights: Alghero Coast, Bosa, Nuraghe Losa, Gennargentu, Orgosolo murals, Sugologone

**Day 5: From Cala Gonone to Cagliari (ferry) – 259 km/161 miles**

The journey follows the panoramic ss125 Orientale Sarda, one of the island's most beautiful routes, offering breathtaking views of mountains and sea. Stops include Costa Rei, known for its long white sandy beaches, before arriving in Cagliari to board the ferry to Sicily.

Highlights: SS125 Orientale Sarda, Costa Rei, Ferry embarkation



**Day 6: From Palermo to Agrigento – 196 km/122 miles**

Start the day with a visit to the Monreale Cathedral, a masterpiece of Norman architecture, and the Royal Palace of Ficuzza, surrounded by nature. The route continues



through the villages of Corleone, known for its historical significance; Palazzo Adriano, with its beautiful square; and Prizzi, nestled in the Sicilian hills. The day ends in Agrigento.

Highlights: Monreale Cathedral, Royal Palace of Ficuzza, Corleone, Palazzo Adriano, Prizzi



#### **Day 8: From Syracuse to Taormina – 183 km/114 miles**

The route leads to Mount Etna, Europe's highest active volcano, for an unforgettable excursion to its crater. Afterward, arrive in Taormina, one of Sicily's jewels, famous for its Greek Theatre and breathtaking views of the sea.

Highlights: Mount Etna



#### **Day 10: From Cosenza to Maratea – 246 km/153 miles**

The journey continues along the ss107, with stops in Morano Calabro and Mormanno, charming hilltop villages. Passing through Scalea, with its beach and caves, the day ends in Maratea, known as the “City of 44 Churches,” overlooking the Tyrrhenian Sea.

Highlights: SS107, Morano Calabro, Mormanno, Scalea, Maratea

#### **Day 7: From Agrigento to Syracuse – 236 km/146 miles**

The morning is dedicated to exploring the Valley of the Temples, one of the most important archaeological sites in the Mediterranean. The journey continues to the Roman Villa of Casale, renowned for its extraordinary mosaics. The day concludes in Syracuse, with its historic center on the island of Ortigia.

Highlights: Valley of the Temples, Villa Romana del Casale, Syracuse



#### **Day 9: From Taormina to Cosenza – 301 km/188 miles**

After taking the ferry to Scilla, visit Scalea, a picturesque fishing village; Tropea, known for its beaches and the Sanctuary of Santa Maria dell'Isola; Pizzo Calabro, with its castle and the famous Tartufo ice cream; and finally, the Sila plateau before arriving in Cosenza.

Highlights: Scilla, Tropea, Pizzo Calabro, La Sila





**Day 11: From Maratea to the Amalfi Coast - 270 km/168 miles**

Travel through Palinuro, famous for its natural arch and sea caves, and the Cilento National Park, a protected natural area. The day concludes along the renowned Amalfi Coast,



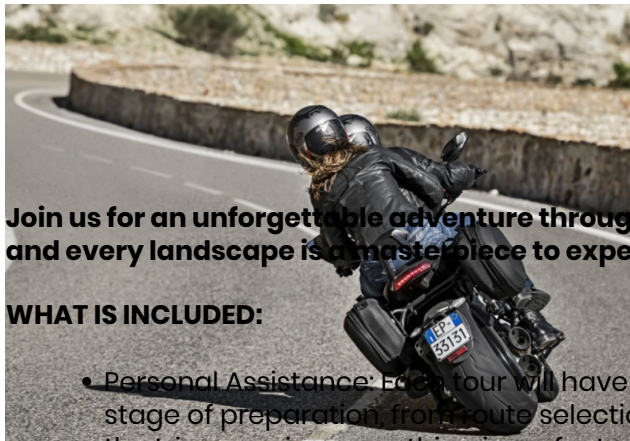
with stops in Positano and other coastal gems.

Highlights: SS18, Palinuro, Cilento National Park, Amalfi Coast, Positano

### Day 12: From the Amalfi Coast to Rome - 359 km/223 miles

The final day includes a visit to the archaeological site of Pompeii, a unique glimpse into ancient history. The journey continues toward Naples, with a possible brief stop, before returning to Rome via the Naples-Rome highway.

Highlights: Amalfi Coast, Pompeii archaeological site, Naples-Rome highway

#### **CANCELLATION POLICY:**

- Up to 60 days before the start date, the advanced payment is kept for the entire following season as credit towards a tour or a rental.
- From the 59th day to the 15th day before the start date, you lose the advanced payment. The balance is kept for the entire following season towards a tour or a rental.
- From the 15th day before the start date, you lose the 50% of the total amount. The other 50% is kept for the entire following season towards a tour or a rental.
